My first impression of him was very positive; he took a step forward, made eye contact, and gave a firm/confident handshake. He then provided a thorough tour of the various areas and workstations, and he was incredibly proud of the facility and his participation.

I don't have much experience at fundraisers, but in my 76 years, I've seen a lot of life. Our impression of the whole affair was one of a family gathering. We saw a group of dedicated people (mentors and young men) confidently and enthusiastically showing off their facility and explaining the operation. We left that day thinking this was an excellent and much-needed program. I had a difficult childhood, and the thought occurred to me that if I had had something like this, I could "own the world" today. And I'm not talking about financial success.

These young men have a real chance to succeed in life, not being hindered by a lack of confidence and self-worth, which is often a product of our society.
