Shop Addition



While constructing an addition to the automotive shop to reduce crowding in the machine and welding area, we faced several challenges, including county regulations, rising material costs, and the impact of Tom's illness. These difficulties have affected the team, and we're committed to supporting each other through this process.

On our fullest workday, we learned that a young man named Nehemiah, who had been part of WT had fallen 35 feet. We prayed for him and later discovered that his foot was facing the wrong way upon landing. Miraculously, after praying, his foot was restored to its proper position. At the hospital, they put on a boot and said that he only suffered a minor fracture.

The core message of **Nehemiah 4** is about how to respond to opposition and discouragement while working on God's plan. *AT Walking Tall we have a tool in one hand and a sword in the other.* The chapter inspires the theme of "build and battle," reminding us that advancing God's kingdom requires prayer and both the strength to construct and the courage to defend against spiritual and external challenges.
